

Dear Members and Friends,

By the time you read this, we will have entered the season of the church year called Pentecost. Pentecost means the 50^{th} day after Easter. Christians mark the completion of Christ's earthly mission and the sending of the Holy Spirit to oversee the birth of the Christian community. In pouring out the Spirit, Jesus kept his promise to

"send another Counselor."

The Holy Spirit was also called by Jesus "The Spirit of Truth." It showed the disciples the meaning of the Old Testament, the significance of Jesus' ministry, and baptized them with the power to carry this Truth to the people of the world. The Holy Spirit is represented in Scripture as a peaceful dove, as Life-giving breath or invisible wind, or as visible fire that transforms what it touches. The Spirit is the Lord's gift to his people to give life, understanding and confidence.

The observance of Pentecost by the Christian Church begins with the Day of Pentecost. It is the climax of the 50 days of the Easter season, the birthday of the Christian Church, and the doorway into the Season of Pentecost. This season extends through summer and fall to the First Sunday of Advent.

The Holy Spirit works within us and throughout the church to extend the ministry of Christ to whom all we meet. May God's Holy Spirit continue to help us spread God's word in this community and beyond.

PARISH NURSING NOTE "Health Tidbits" June 2024 Peggy Saylor, RN

As we head into the summer season, I thought I would write some "tidbits."

One question that comes up during the blood pressure checks is "what actually is your blood pressure?"

The blood pressure consists of two numbers. The top number is known as the systolic blood pressure and it measures the pressure in your arteries when your heart beats. The bottom number is known as the diastolic pressure and it measures the pressure in your arteries when your heart rests between beats. In studies comparing the systolic and diastolic, generally the systolic blood pressure has been a better predictor of risk. A normal blood pressure is less than 120/80 mm/Hg. Feel free to take advantage of the blood pressure checks held on the third Sunday of the months to keep track of your readings. We don't hold the checks over the summer but will resume again in the fall.

With summer months coming up, be sure to have "safe health practices" over the summer. If biking, be sure to wear helmets. When outside, be sure to wear sunscreen even on cloudy days. If swimming, be sure to not swim alone and be sure that if kids are involved, have one designated adult who is observing the kids in the pool.

If there are any subjects that you would like covered in the newsletters, please let me know. While we don't have all the answers, we usually know where to find the answers!!

Chemo Hat Project



This is a reminder that we have yarn for the chemo hats project –see Judy Noll or Steph Wagaman for yarn. We've made sample hats from all of the crochet patterns in the pattern pack, and can help if you get stuck. So far we have 25 hats made!

Project Warm Up America (WUA)

If you are making 7" x 9" rectangles for <u>Project Warm Up America</u>, note that the pieces must be "finished" – i.e. yarn ends sewn in. The Web site has some <u>pattern suggestions</u>, but you can make rectangles in whatever patterns you like. It is a great way to use up partial skeins in your stash. And there are many partial skeins or single skeins in the yarn collection at church.

HOSPITALIZED?

Parish Code for hospitalized parishioners is 321. Please give this code when you are admitted to the hospital so the pastor can be made aware that you are a patient and can administer the pastoral care you require while you are hospitalized.

Please take note, that if you are admitted on a Thursday night, Friday, Saturday, or Sunday, the pastor will not be aware that you are hospitalized until Monday mid-morning, since the church does not have office hours on Friday, and the hospital pastoral care office is not available on Saturday or Sunday.

This means, if you would like the Pastor to know you are hospitalized on the weekend, please call the church office or the Pastor.





Worship & Art: A Congregation's Journey

A few years ago, Calvary Lutheran Church, Laureldale, set out on a journey to be as inclusive as possible. This journey led the congregation to install state-of-the-art cameras (for streaming worship), three 85-inch monitors (for reading the liturgy and music), and a new sound system (that would enable everyone to hear and engage during worship). This was the beginning of the trek to become the congregation God was calling them to be!

The people of Calvary knew they could do more to engage in worship or worshipful experiences so they asked, "How can we engage more of our bodies in worship?" They pondered, brainstormed, and listed ways they could inclusively engage their bodies in worship and Christian life. They decided that creating together would align with their values of inclusivity. This came to fruition through their first collective art project. They began with a Lenten collage that created a dark scene with the tomb of Jesus. The congregation loved the project so much that they asked for more. The next project was for Easter, which included a prominent cross and a rainbow collage surrounding and illuminating the cross. The congregation is currently working on a Pentecost piece that includes a centralized bird erupting from rings of fire. The congregation is in conversation with an art organization to place their piece on display for the wider community to enjoy.

New Outreach Ministry is Found at POP's Treasures

POP's Treasures was established by Prince of Peace Evangelical Church in Bangor to create a location where the community/congregants can donate gently used items /clothing. Presented in a "boutique style" store front where the visitors can see creative displays and purchase said items at a fair price.



The outpouring of community involvement has far exceeded our initial plan. The community supports us with items, and they also attend monthly during the sale days. We have had several new members at the church since the boutique was opened May of 2023. Our attendees support us in other posts on Facebook, letting the community at large know of our location. We are constantly reminded how they feel that this is a wonderful program. We also have individuals who come in our doors that ask to help volunteer.

We applied for and received a Witness and Service Ministry Team Grant to help with the costs to prepare a location on our property and purchase a connex container. The container is used to repurpose and store inventory. Items not sold at the boutique, are then stored until we have our spring or fall rummage sale. Items not sold there are donated to a clothing collection box and other organizations. Currently we utilize the 2 back rooms of the church, along with part of the fellowship hall during the days of our sale, which in total in 7 hours for both days.



While our program was set up to respond at the end of the fiscal year. As we hear of a need, we act in trying to make it happen if we can. It is difficult to say how many attend during the sale days. However, recently we provided a free clothing and houseware day that was attended by 200 individuals.

We currently have provided 3 meals at Safe Harbor, a transition shelter for the homeless. We have donated children's toys, and a stroller to the foster care program. There were also monetary donations to a local youth program, animal shelter, Portland food pantry (PUMP), and the purchase of animals from ELCA Good Gifts.

You may wonder if your congregations could do the same. Yes! If the organizers have the faith it will work, be willing to make changes and to realize that there are many paths to take to make it work. Success can be measured by outreach to the community and the programs it helps. We have been blessed beyond our wildest hopes and dreams. Faith and Science in Paradox* Part 1

Dear Lehigh Mission District,

The above title is borrowed from the essay, "Luther on Copernicus and Models for Faith and Science Dialogue" by The Rev. Dr. Roger E. Timm. From his essay, the retired professor of Religion at Muhlenberg College offers Faith and Science in Paradox as an approach to enter into dialogue with science and religion.

Let me begin this dialogue with science. In 2024 there was a total solar eclipse. There were meteor showers and a full lunar eclipse. In addition, there were the Northern Lights and a planetary alignment. Then there is the upcoming Andromeda Galaxy collision with our Milky Way Galaxy. According to astrophysicist Dr. Neil deGrasse Tyson, the astro collision is to take place in 5 to 6 billion years or after the sun burns out.

By now you may question the obvious: Why worry about this when none of us will be around when this collision takes place? Well, here is the purpose of this conversation between faith and science: How does the fate of the universe compare to our religious understanding of God's creation?

Scientists calculated the exact path of totality of the solar eclipse that covered parts of North America. The next total solar eclipse to be seen in the United States is scheduled for August 23, 2044. The National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) has on its calendar the return of Halley's Comet to pass by the Earth in 2061. These calculations are worked out to a science. Since they don't post a real danger to our belief, we enjoy their continual celestial appearance in our skies.

Keeping in mind these upcoming astro events, science appears to have also calculated the end of the universe as we know it. Scientists' predictions of our evolutionary universe stand in contrast to religious beliefs of God's hands in creation. This particular celestial encounter appears to be the doom of humanity and the universe.

My question: Is the predestination of our solar system an expression of its free will to come to its inevitable end? Here then is Dr. Timm's approach of faith and science in paradox.

The religious belief and understanding of God's creation and that of humanity as we know it will cease to exist. This is quite a paradox to a religious belief in which there is the expectancy of an eternal life. Here then lies faith and science in paradox and the relevancy for the discussion.
